

WHAT IS A BUTTERFLY GARDEN?

Butterflies are some of the most beautiful and interesting creatures on Earth. Many natural butterfly habitats have been lost to human activities like building homes, roads and farms, so a Butterfly Garden is meant to attract and retain butterfly populations.

The plants in the Whitefish Bay Butterfly Garden have been selected for their attractiveness to butterflies, birds and human visitors alike. To encourage butterflies to visit, there are brush piles, shallow water puddles, stones warmed by the sun for resting places, and plants that feed both caterpillars and adult butterflies. Rocks line the perimeter of the garden, defining its borders and the garden is densely planted with perennial, annual and native plants. It is especially important to have flowers in mid to late summer, when most butterflies are active.

MAINTAINING THE BUTTERFLY GARDEN

The Cahill Park Butterfly Garden has become a labor of love for members of the Whitefish Bay Garden Club, who adopted the garden from the Village in 2012. The garden is tucked between the playground and the fence along the south side of Cahill Park.

Restoration to date has included removing invasive plants, refreshing the soil with compost, adding plants from Garden Club members' gardens, and incorporating colorful annual plants. Plants are identified with individual markers, and educational signs will soon be installed describing the ideal habitat to attract and sustain butterflies. An engraved bench with a memorial to long-time Whitefish Bay residents, The Heinrich Family, rests in one corner of the garden, inviting visitors to relax and enjoy the beauty around them.

As all gardeners know, gardens are a work in progress, requiring regular attention to remain healthy and attractive. 
